
A Hero's Work, STAND A Rock Festival, And You

For it is a direct result of your support that David Bagnall has been making a home from home for our students for nearly 15 years – then he gave them a rock festival to help do more...

o see David Bagnall in action as a social care team leader in our residential houses at ChildVision, he looks born for the role: beloved by young people here, you mightn't

ever guess that he began his professional life as a trained chef. But after a stroke at age 35 ended his culinary dreams, he was drawn to ChildVision. It was serendipity.

"I loved everything about ChildVision from the moment I started. For those with low vision who see me," he smiles widely, "they were taken with my earrings and tattoos." Then with such love in his voice, he says "I have a son with a visual impairment and it gave me an opportunity to connect with them." Thanks to your abiding kindness, David has helped the children here for nearly 15 years including cooking up some of the best dinners on campus with them! Mum Runs Blindfolded to Say:

"Thank You for Me, Thank You for Layla, and Thank You for All the Families That Have Little Ones with Albinism..."

"I was born into a family where albinism stretches back 100 years. My nan has it, her four sisters have it. It skipped a generation to me. But it didn't skip a generation for my baby Layla. When I was small, I knew there was something different about me. I remember crying to my dad when the other children wouldn't stop calling me 'snow white' because of my hair. He said, 'But you are Cinderella darling. Snow White has black hair.' Although I eventually dyed my hair to hide my albinism, ChildVision... St. Joseph's then... was a lifeline.

The moment the midwife laid Layla on my chest, my world came crashing down. I was so scared. I rang ChildVision the moment I got out of hospital. And when Layla was just four weeks old we went to our first mother and baby afternoon. I knew straight away I had the support I wanted. I knew Layla had a future.

Layla is now 20 months and her confidence is shining. She needs a lot of supervision because her vision is low, but her curiosity is amazing. She's started on occupational therapy and speech and language therapy. I decided to run

ike any boy his age, little Rían loves cars, football, laughter, and chats. As his dad Éanna says, Rían also happens to have CVI – cerebral visual impairment – and cerebral palsy. When Rían was born he had no visual messages from his eyes to his brain. The technologies you fund like Eyegaze and Insight, which help make the most of every bit of vision, no matter how small – and the therapy he's been able to receive here – have transformed how Rían sees.

Recently he was fitted for mobility equipment and was asked to choose the picture he wanted to appear on his walker. Pictures that just five months ago had been too small for him to see. This time, Rían chose right away: 'Wow wow' for the dog!

It started in 2010, when a club for the vintage cars that David loves had its venue cancelled. Ever the man to spread the word about what children with sight loss face, he asked: Could the club do their photo session at ChildVision? And could they get some rockabilly bands together, and turn it into a fundraising day for the children? The answer, of course, was Yes! – and the Rockin Road Festival was born.

By the time David and Sandra reached the ten-year anniversary of Rockin Road, they'd accomplished the miraculous. A lifetime total of €161,000, donated with love and goodwill by generous hearts just like yours, to fund the work here!
