She came to ChildVision a decade ago as a 12-year-old girl from County Clare with severe sight loss, who relied on her imagination to help her deal with what was going on in her world. Through all the years you stayed by Grace's side – including supporting a shoot-for-the-stars social enterprise programme for students here – and her creative abilities blossomed. Today Grace is weaving her way to a whole new future, thanks to you...

ne of the earliest things Grace remembers was learning how to live with other people with sight loss. She was always aware of her visual impairment and was good at compensating for it – and her decision to be a residential student at ChildVision came very early on attending the weekend events and summer camps that your kind support also helps make possible here.

#### An artisan finds her passion

Then three years ago thanks to incredible donations like yours, we were able to begin the Weave Made It programme, using peg looms made on-site by our dedicated ChildVision carpenter, John. Each day Grace requested to do the weaving programme and it quickly became 'her thing.'

Here, Grace writes about the amazing experience and foundation you gave to her and the equally amazing future she's weaving all her own:

"As part of my programme in Lifelong Learning I was offered the opportunity to learn how to weave and I really enjoy it. When I am weaving I feel relaxed, and I get into the zone of what I'm doing. We use

offcuts from weaving mills around *Ireland that would have otherwise* gone to waste, so we are a sustainable enterprise! Before Christmas we sold our products at a Christmas market. I got the chance to speak to customers and tell them about all the products I had made. It felt amazing that someone appreciated my craft and was willing to spend

money on something I had created. I delivered the rug to Laura myself and I got to meet her, I felt so proud of myself. My Employment Skills trainer and my weaving teacher are working with myself and my family to help me start a weaving business in County Clare. I think it would be amazing to do something I really enjoy and to be my own boss."

Thank you for being there for Grace, and for all our children and young people with severe sight loss, every **step of the way.** Today a budding local artisan is weaving her own magic in a sighted world – and it could never have happened without you. 
### When Everywhere Else Says No, You Help Say Yes

As manager of ChildVision's Early Years Service in Cork, Anita's love for her work is clear the moment you meet her. Each day your kind donations help her and her team work with visually impaired and multi-disabled children from the entire southern half of Ireland. It's a vital service that without your generosity, describes Anita, would leave a huge hole in dozens of little lives:

**Solution** In Cork Early Years we have a 50:50 approach of children with no additional needs, and children with very complex needs including no sight and no mobility, 26 children all coming together to learn. They play together and care for each other unconditionally, without question. Where other places say 'no, we can't take your child,' thanks to our supporters, we can say 'yes' – and provide each child with a full balanced curriculum. Our girls here give so much kindness, patience, and

love to the children. I'm a parent of a child with additional needs myself, and I understand they can't always say how their day was – so we communicate with our families daily. The money we get goes straight to the children on equipment, whether its sensory play, vision assessment tools, or early braille – and we help children learn to use mobility canes from as young as two years of age. What we have here in Cork is remarkable, I can't even explain it. We are forever grateful to our

donors for all the support!



When Shay's complex medical needs left him unable to join his local preschool, you helped Anita (see story at left) - say yes to Shay's family. A smiling delight of a boy with cerebral palsy and no vision in his left eye, Shay is nonverbal and has a special feeding tube to help him with weight gain and reduce illness. Thanks to your steadfast support, Shay is now a champion at his Snap + Core communication software on his special iPad. Sky's the limit, Shay! ♥


# SEVEN SUPERMERO MORSES, POMERED BY YOUR LOVE

**Breed:** Irish Cob Secret power: Mind magic— A wizard of wonders when it comes to working with the students here, Brad makes every child sure that with him at their side, anything is possible!




**Breed:** Shetland Secret power: Empathy and success magic — Small but mighty in every way, Cody is brilliant at making friends with even our most shy and nervous children. She will always have your back!



**Breed:** Irish Cob Secret power: Ultimate protection — Fred makes everyone feel safe... even when they're lying backwards on his back! He also has mystical weather-control: he doesn't like getting wet and tries to enter the arena only when it's dry!



**Breed:** Irish Cob **Secret power:** Escape artistry and invisibility — This equine superhero avoids being clean at all costs, perfecting his powers of invisibility to do so. The ideal friend, Buddy can get you out of any situation while never being caught!



**Breed:** Irish draught horse **Secret power:** The magic of flight — Bull is our gentle giant. He's very attached to all the team here, and we're certain he rides the air currents in the arena. Bull makes every child feel like they can fly, while riding on his back!



**Breed:** Irish Sport Horse (ISH) **Secret power:** Super speed and enhanced intelligence — With her golden forelock and coat of snowy white, Echo is our resident princess. She's fast, super smart, and a little bit precious – but Echo's heart for the children is pure hope and love.



**Breed:** Hunter Secret power: Size manipulation — The biggest of all our therapy horses, Jack's secret power of size manipulation makes even the smallest person feel ten feet tall! And as strapping as he is, Jack still gives the gentlest cuddles.
